### Eligibility:

- You need to be aged between 16-21 years
- Willing to accept our level of support through key work sessions and Support Planning arrangements
- Willing to attend social and life skills programmes that will prepare you for independent living
- Have a genuine need to achieve something positive for yourself
- Be ready to accept Westway House as your interim home and engage with workers that will prepare you for long term resettlement, together with a six months follow up after you have left

### How do I get a placement at Westway House?

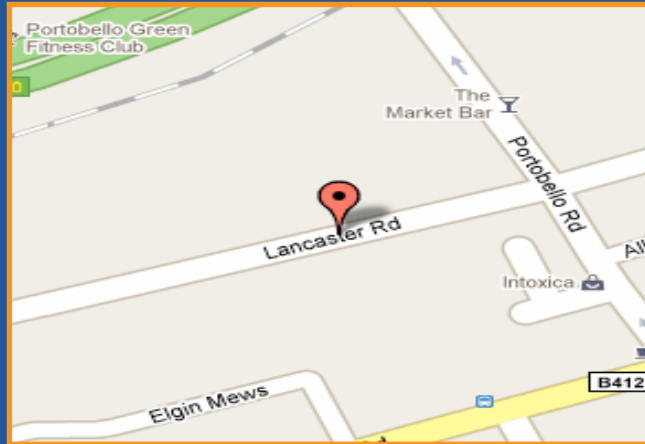
You need to be referred to Westway House by Social Services from any of the following teams:

## Addressing the needs of young people:

The range of services is not limited, but include support on complex issues such as:

Immigration and asylum

Budgeting and managing on low incomes

Gaining Employment

Resettlement preparation & six months follow up

Maximisation of income

Coping with probation issues

Leaving care/home based environment

Overcoming mistrust

Creating self esteem

Escaping abusive relationships

## The support we offer is:

Adaptable to the changing needs of each individual and which enables young people to:

- Maintain their dignity
- Learn from mistakes
- Have a genuine control over their own lives
- Play an active role within the community
- Live in independent accommodation with or without support, if appropriate

We emphasise on helping young people to do as much as possible for themselves to promote their independence, rather than on doing things for them.
